Cambridge Christian School is an independent, one year old through grade twelve, Christian school founded in 1964 as Seminole Presbyterian School, a mission outreach of the Seminole Presbyterian Church. The school was renamed The Cambridge School in 2002 and then Cambridge Christian School in 2007. Our mission is to glorify God in all that we do; to minister to students and families by sharing the message of Jesus Christ and the Bible; to demonstrate excellence at every level of academic, athletic, and artistic involvement; to develop strength of character; and to serve the local and global community. Cambridge currently enrolls 1,000 students (280 high school) and employs over 50 full/part time upper school faculty.
